Considering the average playing experience of our McCall Pickleball players is less than 3 years, the above accomplishments are truly outstanding.

# Tip of the Month

t seems that many Pickleball players, not only in our club but nationally, continue to hit hard, low, driving returns of serve to their opposing serving teams. The "tip" to consider is as follows: try returning your opponents' serves with a little softer, loftier return with a bit of an arc (even if it is just a few feet higher over the net) aimed deeper towards the center of the Pickleball court. This will give you the extra time to approach the kitchen line to join your partner in a court-controlling position.

Also, by aiming the majority of your returns towards the center of the court, you will reduce many errant shots that run off the right and left sides of the court.



### 2015 FALL CLASSIC
