# Pickleball people are passionate

Why put a story about pickleball on the front page of The Star-News this week? If you ask devotees of the sports, they would say it is long overdue.

The opening of the first dedicated indoor pickleball courts in the region last week near Donnelly was a watershed event for a sport that is perfectly suited for the climate and demographics of the area.

And, it is not unique to around here. Pickleball may be the fastest-growing sport in America. More than 3 million people play pickleball in the United States and that number has been growing by more than 10 percent each year over the past decade, according to the website Athletic Business.

Why are pickleball people passionate? For answers, here are some excerpts from "10 Reasons Why I Love Pickleball" by Todd Jungling on the website Pickleball Max, which advocates for the sport:

- Pickleball does not have a steep learning curve. The game can be picked up quickly by most.
- Pickleball can be enjoyed by people of all ages. "If fact, it's likely that if you partner with your grandma or grandpa you will dominate the competition," Jungling wrote.
- The pickleball court is three to four times smaller than a tennis court, meaning longer rallies and less real estate to cover.
- Pickleball is downright fun, and laughter is bound to ensue.
- In addition to the social aspect, pickleball can also quench the competitive thirst as well.
- Pickleball can lower blood pressure, boost the immune system, reduce stress and improve mental acuity. "It sure beats getting on the treadmill for an hour!" Jungling wrote.

So, step aside, Midas Gold, Wilks brothers and wake boats. Make way for real news - pickleball in Valley and Adams counties is a big deal.

#### Three regulation courts dedicated for growing sport

Joy washed over Mike Heyer as he watched about 60 guests scamper after rogue pickleballs and share laughs with one another.

Heyer presided over the dedication of three new indoor regulation pickleball courts last Thursday night at the Shiloh Bible Conference camp west of Donnelly.

"Honestly, the thing that kept coming to mind was 'build it and they will come," said Heyer, 57, of Donnelly.

The new courts are the results of a collaboration among the church camp, the Valley County Pickleball Club and the Mountain Meadows Pickleball Club.

The two clubs had long been seeking an indoor facility with regulation courts that would allow them to consistently play pickleball throughout the winter.

It was not until Heyer attended a recent Sunday service at the Donnelly Bible Church that he learned that the Shiloh Camp's multiuse facility was open for other community uses.

Now, the clubs have access to the courts during dedicated time slots for public use of the 6,000 square foot heated facility, which is located at 13165 Gestrin Rd.

Heyer and about 10 volunteers spent about 100 hours and \$5,000 installing the new textured floor with regulation pickleball lines over the concrete slab originally installed with the facility.

"One night I was literally here from 8 p.m. until 9 a.m. the next morning on a machine grinding because had to get the sealer off before (the new floor) would bond," Heyer said.

The end result is a quality trio of pickleball courts that should last a minimum of 30 to 40 years and continue to accommodate the sport's growing popularity in Valley County, he said.

"The goal for this building is to use it for the camps and we want the community to use it when we're not using it," said Mike Crase, executive director for the Shiloh Bible Conference.

"So, pickleball coming in and using it is just awesome," Crase said, noting he has since become a pickleball player.

#### **Public Hours**

The courts are open for public use Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. and Monday through Thursday from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. Monday nights from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. are designated specifically for basketball.

The camp suggests a \$5 donation for each use to help pay for maintenance and utilities. The camp also requires minors to be accompanied by an adult and urges guests to wear non-marking shoes.

"If you're somewhat of a purist, this is it," Heyer said of the quality of the courts. "It's good enough that we can draw the best Boise players for tournaments."

Heyer moved to the area recently and has seen the number of his friends quickly grow thanks to the 150-plus members of the two pickleball clubs.

"I moved here and met everyone instantly through pickleball, so the social atmosphere is therapeutic," he said.

Several other attendees spoke to the social aspect of the game, including Terri Duggan of Denver, who attended the dedication as part of her quest to play pickleball in all 50 states.

"You'll either fall in love with the sport or the people, one or the other," Duggan said.

Donnelly resident Doug Dvorak, who served as host of the celebration, said he introduces new players to pickleball through free clinics as a way to enrich the lives of others like it did for him.

"We know we've got to give back because this game has given us so much," Dvorak said.

Other attendees credited pickleball for allowing them to stay active despite aging joints from decades of chasing tennis balls around courts nearly four times the size of a pickleball court.
